

## **Graduate Certificate in Immigration Studies Admission Information**

The application deadline is January 1 of each year for admission to the program in the fall of that year. There are no spring admissions. To avoid any delays in the processing of your application, it is recommended that you provide your application, transcripts, test scores and application fee to the [Graduate College's Admissions Office](#) by December 1.

All applicants are required to have a bachelor's degree in any subject from a regionally accredited institution; a GPA of 3.0 (on a 4.0 scale) or higher in the last two years of work leading to a bachelor's degree; and must meet all admission requirements of the Graduate College. Applicants will be evaluated based on undergraduate transcripts, three letters of recommendation, required test scores (GRE or TOEFL) and a statement of intent. Past course work in immigration studies or experience working with immigrants will be considered, but is not required. Students already admitted/enrolled in an ASU graduate degree program who wish to apply to the Immigration Studies certificate program will automatically be considered for admission.
